EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

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MICHIGAN (MI)

Highlights

- *Number of disputed ballots: 270,000 votes (approx.)*
- *Joe Biden's winning margin: 154,188 votes (2.8%)*
- *Michigan's electoral college votes under dispute: 16 votes (36 would need to be flipped for a Trump win)*
- *Independent forensic audit investigation: Antrim County and State Election Commission*
- *Three (3) Sheriffs have received evidence, and are in conversation with Election Integrity Force & Fund (Sandy Keisel) regarding investigation, and are requesting guidance with regards to election, related election fraud laws, and corresponding investigation methods (i.e., Jackson County, additional) [Suggestion: connect Michigan Sheriffs with Sheriffs from other states who are engaged in the same investigations]*
- *Jan 14, 2022: Michigan's Attorney General requested federal prosecutors to open a criminal investigation into 16 Republicans who submitted certificates stating they were the state's presidential electors contesting the Joe Biden "win" in 2020*

Election Fraud in Michigan: Selected Reporting

Outstanding Issues

- Padded voter rolls
- Suspicious vote spikes going 95%+ to Biden
- 270,000 votes counted without independent observation
- Outstanding/unresolved integrity issues with Dominion counting machines
- Eyewitness accounts of illegal ballot handling
- Numerous counties where ballot tallies did not match records
- Overuse of tally adjudication within Dominion software
- Audits being performed by the same county staff who performed the elections
- Obstruction of further audits

Michigan Secretary of State – Bureau of Elections: 2020 Elections Audit

- Of 83 county clerks completing post-election audits, 43, or 52%, had not viewed the related webinars or videos, though the bureau noted that does not necessarily mean they were not familiar with the required procedures.
- Of those 43 clerks, eight, or 19%, were not fully certified at the time of the post-election audit.
- Of 22 other county election officials who conducted post-election audits, 13, or 59%, had not viewed the webinars or videos.
- Of 361 assigned post-election audits, 31 were not submitted by county clerks to the state's eLearningCenter, and 12 were never completed. Of the 330 reports that were submitted to the eLearning Center, 34 were submitted two to 47 days late.
- The bureau did not ensure clerks hand counted ballots during the post-election audits, as required. For 40 of the 239 completed post-election audits, county clerks did not hand count the U.S. Senate race ballots, as required. And in 12 of those 40 audits, hand counting did not occur for any race.

Canvass: Macomb County, MI

Jacky Eubanks, candidate for Michigan State Representative, is leading a grassroots canvassing effort, going door-to-door verifying ballot and voter information from the 2020 election. She started with her hometown of Chesterfield, Michigan, in north-east Detroit, and described her findings as “both alarming and disgusting”. Roughly 18-20% of residences had anomalies or irregularities. Biden’s winning margin in the state was only 2.8%. The types of anomalies include:

- *The registered voter does not exist at that address, and has not for 2–25 years*
- *The registered votes does reside at the address, but states they did not vote, despite a vote being recorded in their name (some even producing their uncast absentee ballot)*
- *Addresses associated with businesses, which is illegal*
- *Incomplete addresses, such as specifying a building number but no apartment number*
- *She also found that cities in Macomb County have an unexplained excess of 170,000 more registered voters than people of voting age (and that does not even account for citizenship status or felon status). Again, this number is higher in one single county than Biden’s winning margin of 154,188 votes in the state.*

Patrick Colbeck

Patrick Colbeck formerly served two terms in the Michigan Senate and was investigating election integrity issues prior to the 2020 elections. He has written extensively about the integrity issues discovered during this election, with most published on his website LetsFixStuff.org. The DePerno Reports

- Attorney Matthew DePerno collaborated with several cyber security firms and forensic experts as part of his election-related lawsuits and has amassed at least 20 technical reports on security vulnerabilities and other evidence of fraud during the election, with a special focus on Michigan.
- The 20+ reports are published at on his website, with latest updates found on his Twitter page.
- *“If we extrapolate the findings in Antrim County — which match almost identically with what they come out with in Arizona — if we extrapolate those results to the entire state, not counting Wayne County which is Detroit, there’s 500,000 fraudulent votes, that’s 500,000 phantom ballots in the state.” - Attorney Matt DePerno*
- DePerno has fueled Trump’s election fraud claims by pursuing a lawsuit in Antrim County. DePerno argues a well-explained and quickly fixed error that affected unofficial results actually showed problems with Dominion Voting Systems machines used across the country, though a hand recount and state audits affirmed the accuracy of the Antrim County results.
- DePerno is endorsed by President Donald Trump and Lt.Gen. Michael T. Flynn (U.S. Army, ret); Michigan Republican Party Co-Chair Meshawn Maddock, Administrative Vice-Chair Diane Schindlbeck, Ethnic Vice Chair Bernadette Smith and Grassroots Vice Chair Marian Sheridan.

The Halderman Report

- J. Alex Halderman, a professor of computer science and engineering at the University of Michigan, wrote a report (view PDF) released and approved by the Michigan Department of State that argued human error and poor practices led to early tabulation errors in Antrim County but that the results were fully rectified and

eventually accurate. While Halderman acknowledged vulnerabilities in the election technology, he stressed that *“there is no evidence that any of these problems was ever exploited in Antrim County.”*

- Several other sources dispute this claim, including Attorney Matthew DePerno and Analysts James Thomas Penrose IV and Jeffrey Lenberg. They released an 8-page report and affidavit citing inaccuracies and glaring omissions in Halderman’s report, and rebutting his conclusions.

Election Fund & Force (EF&F)

Election Integrity Fund & Force was founded in 2020 in an effort to protect the 2020 election. The goal was to train poll watchers to help secure the election. After the election occurred, the Board decided they must continue to drive for election integrity. They developed a vision to unify the United States through transparent and trusted election. Our belief is through transparency comes trust and through trust the country would be better able to unite behind the leadership.

For the past year the organization has been developing, supporting and delivering many efforts to move towards this vision, including participating in gathering and delivering approximately 10,000 affidavits to the Michigan legislature asking for an audit, delivering a rebuttal to the McBroom/ways and oversight report, meeting with representatives, speaking at major events to drive awareness and organize volunteers. Additionally, we are coordinating with other organizations in Michigan working on election integrity and working with leaders in other states to maximize best practice learnings and implementation. We are currently leading the effort to canvass and data mine for irregularities. The goal of this effort is to clean the voter rolls prior to the 2022 elections and amass a volunteer team that can be mobilized to protect the 2022 elections.

Discussion: FOIA Requests

Michigan had a court order after 2018 for the Secretary of State’s office Jocelyn Benson to purge 50k invalid voters from the roles. The SoS office didnt respond until spring 2020 with, we cant until after the 2020 election. Then in January 2021 the SoS purged 177,000 voters... more than the margin of victory 154k. Perhaps a FOIA request for the 177k purged voters from the roles would be more efficient. The 50k court order was from 1 county in Detroit.

We should also FOIA request which counties failed the States Election Audit canvass as reported by the State Election Commission Official Audit. The report states that the counties typically fail polling station numbers but in 2020 it was the mail in ballots that created the most discrepancies. It would be nice to see the actual data from the audit and not the published summary which glosses over significant issues.

It might also be worth FOIA the contract that allowed a 3rd party GOTV to manage the Michigan Voter roles and prevented county Secretaries of State from editing them. All voter file logs, and communication while managed by them should also be requested.

Since the machines were erased we could also request the 2020 election machine data. This is also necessary to validate the canvassing results. Obviously it no longer exist in violation of the 22 month federal retention requirement. Invalidating the 2020 election results.

The discrepancies in the State Audit highlight many issues that got covered up.
